The eight weekly sessions will take place at the Wellingborough African Caribbean Association, Rock Street, starting from Wednesday, October 6, between 7pm and 9pm.

A mind, body and health workshop will be taking place at the Wellingborough African Caribbean Association between 6.30pm and 8.30pm on Thursday, October 21. Admission is free.

A black film screening afternoon will be taking place at The Castle on Monday, October 25.

It will take place between 2pm and 5pm and will include Coming to England, a drama adaption of Floella Benjamin's book which tells the story of a 10 year-old from Trinidad moving to England in the early 60s.

It will also include A Great and Mighty Walk which was produced and narrated by Wesley Snipes. It chronicles the life and times of African American historian John Henrik Clarke.

And on Saturday, October 30, the Big Deep Roots Black History Month Finale will be taking place at The Castle. It will feature Mabulu from Mozambique, a nu-generation African band fusing traditional roots with rap and hip hop.

Tickets cost £10 or £7 for concessions, and the show will start at 8.30pm.
